## What Does Baby Jesus Have to do With Me?



Let the earth now praise the Lord, Who has truly kept His Word. And at last to us did send; Christ the sinner's help and friend. (CW 28:1)



Jesus is born! But where can He be found? He did not come displaying His power, but instead, He came in a very humble way, being born in a barn, surrounded by animals of the Father's creation. The angels announced His arrival. They sang and praised Him as they urged the shepherds to run into town to see Him. At long last, the Savior, the King of the Jews, had arrived. What was the shepherds' response? After they had seen Him, they started telling everyone they met, "Jesus is born!" What tremendous joy and excitement they must have felt. This is the reason they had been waiting and waiting.

Later He was revealed to the Gentiles. God used a star to prompt the Magi in their search for Jesus from the day He was born. He is the Savior for all people. Some of our gifts include cleaning the church, teaching Sunday School, assisting with church activities, serving meals or snacks in the kitchen, spending time with the children of the congregation, visiting members who can no longer enjoy fellowship at church, reaching out to that neighbor or friend who may not know the message of Jesus, or coming to enjoy fellowship time with each other. These are only a few of the gifts we can give back to Jesus. We all have received a gift from above. "Every good and perfect gift is from above." (James 1:17) What is yours? Have you found it?
