



### **BEFORE AND AFTER**


Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. But now He has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in His sight, without blemish and free from accusation. Colossians 1:21-22



Don't you just love the commercials for cleaning products? The stove has tomato sauce spilled all over and baked on; yet with just one wipe, the stove sparkles like new. I have tried many different ones on the market, and none of them ever get my stove to sparkle like it did when we first installed it. Oh well, I guess you can't get out every stain...or can you?

When the Apostle Paul writes these words to believers, he does a "Before and After". Before you were in Christ Jesus, before you were a believer, you were enemies of God. Because of the sinful evil that you were born with and the sins you acted out each day, you were alienated, separated from God. You were

down right filthy - worse than tomato sauce burnt onto a stove top. And though you may have tried to scrub away your sins by yourself, the stain of sin remained, and the consequences did too.



But look at what Christ has done! By the sacrifice of Himself on the cross, by His holy perfect death every single bit of your sinful stain, wrinkle, blemish has been removed! This is what it means that your sins and mine are forgiven!

On the one hand, our mind reads these words, but our heart struggles to grasp them. After all, our own conscience keeps accusing us and knows full well what we have done in the past. Not only that, but there are probably a few people who could corroborate with our conscience. The problem is that our heart is

focusing on the "before" and not on that "after" which is always true and real in Christ.

This is what God has done: "He has reconciled you by Christ!" God has removed every stain of sin so that now you can be assured that you are at peace with God through Jesus your Savior.

Prayer: Lord, help me to always remember that Jesus has removed all my sins. Thank you for this precious gift. May I be at peace this day and always. Amen.

# **A Short Story**






That is what the writer of the book of Ecclesiastes said. and he said it three different times in his book. It sounds simple enough: Somehow find the ability to lean back in your hammock on your day off and say, "What a satisfying life this all is!"

The Bible says about God, "You open Your hand and satisfy the desires of every living thing" (Psalm 145:16). Many believers bow their heads and speak this verse before they eat their food. In their prayer at their dinner tables they acknowledge that God is the source of their satisfaction. They recognize it too when they pray this part of the Lord's Prayer: "Give us today our daily bread."

The Apostle Paul told a young pastor, "If we have food and clothing, we will be content with that" (1 Timothy 6:8). Perhaps those who demand more satisfaction from life are not thinking of the simple but sublime satisfaction that is the desire of many hearts. They forget that in their work—whatever it may be—they can glorify God with faithfulness and cheerfulness and thankfulness that they have the ability to feed themselves and their family. Those are the aspirations of a loving God for our satisfaction.

Satisfaction in our lives does not come because of what we do but because of what God does. He takes care of us...body and soul. He feeds us. He sent Jesus to rescue us from His great dissatisfaction over our sin. He promises to be with us and bless the work of our hands. He says that what we do for Him will not be in vain.

Be satisfied—truly satisfied—with that!

# News About Our Church Family

### LWMS 50th Annual Convention

The 50th annual Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS) convention was held June 27-30. LWMS comprise women dedicated serving Jesus by increasing awareness ar support of WELS Missions, both in the U.S. and abroad. LWMS mission project offerings presented at the Convention totaled \$75,221.36 and worship services offerings totale \$59,096.74.

Each year, LWMS members vote on which missions their offerings will support and this year offerings will be dispersed between students in the multi-ethnic seminary program and Indonesia projects. Convention worship offerings will be dispersed between the Caribbean Mission ary Conference and Nigeria projects. LWMS kids c.a.r.e. provide \$53,284.22 to home missions for VBS support. LWMS has grown considerably over the last 50 years from 256 attendees at the first convention to 1,756 this year-the largest convention in LWMS history-448 of those being fit time attendees. Hali Dessecker, vice president of LWMS Board of Directors, says, "Everyone talks about how it is on an organization for little old ladies; it is not. Women of all ages are interested in missions and every woman can raise awareness for missions." There are 880 member congrega tions in LWMS, organized into 61 circuits. "If your congre tion is a member, then as a woman member of that church, you are automatically a member of LWMS."

As presenters share their experiences in the mission fields their struggles and blessings– attendees are reminded of h important their prayers and offerings are in raising awareness to further WELS mission work. Jean Martin, presider of LWMS Board of Directors, says, *"For me, just hearing the missionaries and their wives tell about what they go through in their daily lives is such an experience. You get caught up it, you say to yourself, 'What can do to help?' and you want share your experience."*
