





Put on Christ

A missionary to China was telling the story of Jesus to a group. A few minutes passed when one said, "Oh, yes, we knew him; he used to live here." The missionary said, "No, he lived centuries ago in another land." But the man insisted he had seen Jesus, saying, "No! He lived in this village and we knew him!" They then showed him the grave of a medical missionary who had lived, served, healed, and died in that community.

Would people say that of us? Would they say, "We remember her Christ-like character; when she entered a room the fragrance of Christ came with her"? Or "When he came into the office, the whole place just seemed different"? When people see us, do they see Christ shining right through us, like a stained-glass window? The Gospel is communicated by a person who not only speaks it, but lives it. Scripture says, "What kind of people ought you be? You ought to live holy and godly lives as you look forward to he day of God and speed its coming" (2 Peter 3:11-12).

A wise man once said, "The best way to send an idea is to wrap it up in a person." That's what God did in Christ. The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. That's what we do when we "put on Christ" each day where we live, work and play.

If I asked you to suddenly remember five good sermons you've heard in your life, you might have a hard time. But if I asked you to name five persons who had "put on Christ" and through whom God really touched you, I'm sure you could point right away to a parent, an aunt, a grandfather, a teacher... in the same way, as we share the love of God in Jesus Christ by our words and actions, God can shine through us to bring others to "put on Christ."

That is my question to you. Are you, as Luther said, a "little Christ" where ever you go? Do people see you more of the world or of God's Word? Do your non-Christian friends say, "Oh John isn't all that different from us, even though he is a Christian. He drinks too much just like we do at a party. He enjoys a dirty joke as much as we do." Or do they say, "There is something different about those Christians. Look how they love one another! They really live by their faith. We want that faith, too!"

Then we can direct them to the Author and Finisher of our faith, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We can encourage them to "put on Christ." We can encourage them to search the Scriptures daily to know his will and plan for their lives. We can help them develop a richer prayer life, and they, too, can become a "little Christ" where ever they go.

Have You Read Any Good Books Lately?



Thanks to our faithful young librarians, we have some great suggested reading displayed on the shelves in our church library. There is a biography of Luther and one of the books from C.S. Lewis' *Chronicles of Narnia* series. You will even find a couple of different study Bibles on display, one for adults and another for children. It's almost as though our librarians are asking, "Have you read any good books lately? Check these out!"

Well, have you read any good books lately?

That seems to be the question that Jesus poses in the opening verses of His revelation to saint John. Listen to our Savior's reading suggestion:

Revelation 1:1-3 (NIV1984) The revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants what must soon take place. He made it known by sending His angel to His servant John, who testifies to everything he saw—that is, the Word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ. Blessed is the one who reads the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, because the time is near.

The Lord reveals His plan to return to earth as Judge of all. He isn't just *suggesting* that we read His Word. Our Savior attaches a blessing to everyone who reads the Bible and takes it to heart. Jesus' desire is that all people read His book, repent of their sins, believe in Him as their Savior, and worship Him as their Lord. In so doing, we are glorifying the only true God, strengthening our faith, building our confidence for heaven on the words and works of God's Son, and preparing for that time which is near – the return of the King.



You are blessed when you gather in God's house on Sunday morning or Thursday evening to meditate on the holy Scriptures and praise the Lord with members of this Christian congregation. You are blessed when you begin the day reading the daily *Meditations* or some other biblical devotion book. You are blessed when you spend time on Sunday, Tuesday, or Thursday morning in Bible study with a group of your fellow believers. You are blessed when you close the day with God's Word and prayer before you drift off to sleep.


Why? Reading Jesus' book brings us into contact with our sin and God's grace. It reminds us of the pathetic and desperate situation we face as sinners, and the amazing grace and mercy of our forgiving Lord. Pondering the Law and Gospel equips us to lead a more God-pleasing life, so that we turn from temptation and strive for service to the Lord. We are empowered to live our faith, with actions and attitudes of gratitude to the One who rescued us from a well-deserved hell and prepares us for never-ending bliss in heaven. That is how we are blessed when we read the Word of God...and hear it...and take it to heart. We are preparing ourselves to go home to be with Jesus.




So, find a good book and read! Better yet, find THE good book, God's Word, and join me in preparing for what must soon take place...Jesus is coming soon!

A Short Story



I Need More...



FAITH



A couple decades ago, our churches used a special series titled "Faith Alive." It included a theme banner and four weekly pamphlets. One of those pamphlets had the additional subtitle "Trusting God." Both of those titles are very pertinent to this article: "I Need More FAITH."

I can't imagine any honest Christian who wouldn't say a hearty "Amen" to that statement. Because of the common weakness of our sinful, human nature, the fervent request that a greatly distressed father made to Jesus

with regard to his son's great need and his own weakness of faith has often struck a chord: "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24)

Notice how that statement is punctuated with only a semicolon with regard to his faith, but an exclamation point with regard to his unbelief. Unfortunately, that's the reality of the faith-life of God's people. We wish our own "Faith Alive" banner were punctuated with an exclamation mark or at least a simple period. But we know a question mark suggesting uncertainty or doubt gets in there way too often.

Just about every Sunday the worshipers in our churches make a confession of faith with the Apostles' or Nicene Creed. The key truths of the Christian faith are very briefly and yet adequately summarized in those statements. There are no exclamation points in either of those great, ancient creeds—just commas and periods that acknowledge the basic scriptural facts. That's an important aspect about saving faith: knowing the truth about the true God and the Savior he has given us.

Since this faith is totally a gift, we need to keep going to the Lord with this request, "Lord, I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!" We keep having a problem with unbelief because it's such a "natural" part of us. Faith is a supernatural thing, and it is kept alive and strong only with the supernatural Word of our supernatural God.

The most important thing to remember about faith is that it derives all of its strength from its object, that on which it rests. As a famous preacher once said, "It is not your hold on Christ that saves you; it is Christ. It is not even your faith in Christ that saves you, though that be the instrument. It is Christ's blood and merit." There might indeed be many instances where our trusting faith is pretty shaky, but the Savior and his promises are rock solid. With this subject of faith it's most important to hear him speak with exclamation points, "I love you! I have saved you! I will never let you go!"
