

Christians can hardly celebrate Christmas without at least one mention of the prophet Isaiah. The "Gospel Prophet" included many passages in his scrolls which point the reader to the promised Messiah. Reference after reference direct our attention not only to the announcement of the Savior's birth, but also to His characteristics and especially to His work of redeeming sinful souls with His bloody sacrifice.

This Advent season we prepare our hearts to celebrate again the fact of God's love for sinners, in sending His Son to rescue us from a much-deserved eternity in hell. New Friends

New Friends, a Christian-based friendship network that is part of *Jesus Cares Ministries*, a ministry of The Lutheran Home Association, brings together teens and college students with families with special needs children to build relationships by focusing on abilities and not disabilities and to create an atmosphere the entire family can enjoy.

The idea of developing *New Friends* on the high school level started with Jackie Mayer, a parent to a child with special needs. Mayer wanted a place where Dylan could go to make new friends, have fun, and simply be himself. She wanted a place where other families in similar situations could support one another.

The door started to open when she joined *Jesus Cares Ministries* as the community relations director in 2011. She gave a presentation at Manitowoc Lutheran High School (MLHS) about what it's like to have a family member with special needs and how the students could help. She asked if any students could set aside one day a month to be friends with kids in the area who needed some time to have fun and be themselves.

Nearly 50 students came to the first *New Friends* day and the program has been thriving since. Following the initial success at MLHS, both Saint Croix Lutheran High School, West St. Paul, Minn., and Kettle Moraine Lutheran High School (KML), Jackson, Wis., have started *New Friends* programs with Mayer's help. Not only are the kids playing together and making new friends, but *New Friends* is also an opportunity to reach out in the community.

Mayer says the Manitowoc program has served 49 families, some without a church home.

Each meeting starts with a message of hope in Jesus. While Mayer says the kids with special needs love ing somewhere where they can be themselves and

going somewhere where they can be themselves and have fun, the high school student volunteers are taking away as much or more from the program. Miya Preston, a senior at KML, encourages more students to get involved, "God gives you this opportunity to show your faith and love for others in a unique and exciting way, and the benefits are remarkable. You can see the difference it's making in these kids' lives, and along the way, it also makes a difference in your life as well."



Do You Shop at Kwik Trip, Copps, or Diggly Wiggly? Then Scrip is For You!

What is Scrip? Scrip is a program where companies sell you gift cards at face value and give a percentage back to the organization. For example, if you purchase a \$100 Kwik Trip card and they give us 10% back, the organization will be credited \$10, but you still get the full \$100 to use. Each company designates a different percentage for the program. St. John's Lutheran School in Montello sells Scrip and the percentage given back helps to reduce the cost of tuition. Yes I Love Jesus, but You Want Me to do What??

Jesus gave all believers a mission before he ascended into heaven. "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20) In short, we are to let others know about the great things that God has done for us. This is our "special task" from our Lord and Savior. He entrusted us each with this special task and expects that we will do it for Him. How can we accomplish this task? One word: evangelism.

We love God and we are thankful that he sent his Son for us, but the word *evangelism* can be intimidating. When you hear it, you may think it means going door to door and telling people they are sinners and that you believe in Jesus' death and resurrection. While this is a wonderful way to spread the message, let's face it, not all of us are comfortable doing that. We may feel inadequate for that kind of task, but that doesn't mean that we are not fulfilling his mission in other ways. The Lord gives each and every one of us different gifts, and participating in this scenario may or may not be one of your gifts. You may not stand in the middle of the town declaring that God sent his Son to die for all people, but there are many ways that you can still share your faith and let others see it. I believe that many of us do these things already and do not always realize that, through them, we are showing our faith.

For any kind of mission, one must first prepare themselves. Before a race, people will do strength and endurance training. Before a meeting for work or school, there must be some sort of preparation. How should we train and prepare to be a light shining for Jesus? We should study, study. Dive into God's Word. Read it and re-read it. (1 Peter 3:15) The Gospel message is powerful and uplifting. God's Word creates a joy in our hearts. This kind of joy cannot help but be shown in our words and actions. Holding this kind of joy into ourselves should be impossible. We want God's love to pour forth through us and onto others.


We may do this simply by being kind to others, helping them when you see a need, whether at the grocery store, clinic, or at church. We may have so much joy that we cannot stop smiling, which will cause people to wonder how you can be happy all the time when all around us, life seems to be getting worse every day. Recipe Corner: On-the-Go Breakfast Cookies

Yield: 2 dozen

Ingredients:

1 package Pillsbury® Big Deluxe® refrigerated oatmeal raisin cookies

1/2 cup Pillsbury® Coconut Pecan Frosting 1/2 cup quick-cooking or old-fashioned oats

1/4 cup flaxseed

1 cup walnuts, coarsely chopped

- 3. Bake 12-16 minutes or until edges are light golden brown. Cool completely on sheets, about 20 minutes.
