

# **Easter is All About You!**

"Because I live, you also will live." -John 14:19

"Happy Holidays!" Sound out of place in April? It doesn't have to. This month marks arguably the most important holiday of the year....Easter. Why? Because Easter is ALL ABOUT YOU! But isn't Easter about Jesus, God's Son? Yes, Easter is not so much about colored eggs, candy, baskets and bunny rabbits, or about a new spring outfit or vacation time. It's about Jesus. But Easter is also about you!

At Easter we celebrate the FACT that Jesus Christ rose from the dead. We confess it each week in church. Every Sunday we remember it. This miraculous event we confess as believers is certainly reason for celebration, especially since Jesus had to suffer so much and have his life cut so short. But Easter is much more than knowing the significance of Easter, it is a matter of life and death!

You see, Jesus could have chosen not to die. He had the power to stop his murderers. He said, "No one takes it (my life) from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again" (John 10:18). Jesus had the power to walk away, unharmed from his captors. And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood. But behold, the hand of him who betrays Me is with Me on the table. For the Son of Man goes as it has been determined, but woe to that man by whom He is betrayed!" And they began to question one another, which of them it could be who was *qoing to do this.* 







In the Star-Spangled Banner, Americans sing about living in the "land of the free and home of the brave." But do we always feel free? Aren't there times when we feel as if "chains" were shackling us? There are the chains of responsibility at work and home, the pains we face or the financial strains that come our way. There are the chains of guilt that press us down as we look back at our past wrongdoings.

This month we celebrate Easter. What is Easter all about? In the Bible Job tells us, "I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end He will stand upon the earth" (Job 19:25). Easter celebrates the reality that our Redeemer lives. A redeemer is someone who delivers others out of trouble by paying a great price for their freedom. Jesus, the Son of God, came into this world to be our Redeemer. From what did He redeem us?


# Lutheran Girl Pioneers National Convention

"What we heard over and over at the festival was how *Come Follow Me* works so well as an outreach tool," says Mr. Steve Boettcher, the film's director and producer. "The film makes it simple for anyone to present the gospel to a friend or neighbor in a way that's straightforward, compelling, and doctrinally sound."

### Do You Shop at Kwik Trip, Copps, or Piggly Wiggly? Then Scrip is For You!

What is Scrip? Scrip is a program where companies sell you gift cards at face value and give a percentage back to the organization. For example, if you purchase a \$100 Kwik Trip card and they give us 10% back, the organization will be credited \$10, but you still get the full \$100 to use. Each company designates a different percentage for the program. St. John's Lutheran School in Montello sells Scrip and the percentage given back helps to reduce the cost of tuition. ### **A True Easter Celebration**



In our increasingly commercialized world, it's difficult to pull our attention away from the chocolate bunnies—the getting, not giving— and hard to focus on the real reason for the season.



In almost every conversation about Easter for kids that I had with parents and teachers, Resurrection Eggs came up. Available commercially, but also fun

to make on your own, these are colorful plastic eggs filled with symbols of Easter and Christ's passion. Go to www.busychickadees.com/2012/03/howto find simple do-ityourself directions. All you'll need is an egg carton, twelve plastic eggs, a Sharpie, and a printer! Hide an egg each day of Holy Week. When it's discovered (or at family devotion time), open the egg and tell the story that goes with each symbol. You can collect the eggs in a basket for a final review on Easter Sunday.

#### **Create an Easter library**



Check your church library or Christian bookstore for children's Bibles, Lenten devotionals, and other books and movies

on Easter. Building a collection of religious Easter books that comes out only once a year is another exciting way to focus your family on what Easter really means. The books can be placed in a special area, or unwrap one a day for a thrilling after-lunch or bedtime story. (Even if the books are "old," the excitement will be there!) And it's never too early to use the Bible itself.

Easter is a wonderful time for music too. Teach your children a few familiar Easter hymns so (f) they can be ready for boisterous Easter Sunday singing. Piggyback songs (new words to old melodies), such as 'Jesus is alive! Jesus is alive! Now we all can celebrate! Jesus is alive!" (sung to the tune of "The Farmer in the Dell"), are easy for any parent to sing. Add some rhythm instruments and

have a true Easter parade! Don't be afraid to expose kids to "heavier" music too. Even young children can enjoy Handel's Messiah or Bach's St. John Passion.

#### **Reinforce the meaning of Easter**

Filling your home with Easter decorations like crosses- find religious window clings- is another way to reinforce the true meaning of Easter. An Easter lily just starting to bloom can reinforce the idea that Jesus was the first to rise, and like the other lily buds, we too will rise someday. Online retailers (such as Oriental Trading Company) often feature great teaching tools, like Easter story finger puppets, felt board or sticker stories. Children can role-play the Easter story with puppets or use sheets and towels for their own costumes.

Easter experiences are easy to create. 60 Make butterfly crafts. Take a spring nature walk and talk about the new life all around the neighborhood and the new life Jesus' resurrection gives us. As you color eggs, incorporate spiritual symbols (use masking tape to make crosses on the eggs before dying, then remove the tape after the eggs are dry). Bake cross cutout cookies for the neighbors. See the next page for a great cookie recipe. Fill traditional baskets with chocolate crosses and new Easter books. These are all excellent ways to celebrate Easter with your family.

Attending Holy Week services and carefully explaining the significance of each service is also an essential part of your family's Easter celebration!

Easter ideas abound! Choose a few to get started, and may God bless your family's true celebration of Easter!

#### **Recipe Corner: Easter Story Cookies**

This is a great recipe to remind us of the REAL story of Easter: that Jesus our Savior is not dead but has risen! Make this recipe as a family!

#### You will need:

1 cup whole pecans	a zipper baggy
1 teaspoon vinegar	1 wooden spoon
3 egg whites	scotch tape
a pinch salt	your Bible
1 cup sugar	
Instructions:	

#### These are to be made the evening before Easter.

- Preheat oven to 300F.
- Place pecans in zipper baggy and beat them with th wooden spoon to break into small pieces.

After Jesus was arrested He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. **Read: John 19:1-3** 

- Smell the vinegar. Put 1 tsp vinegar into mixing bow When Jesus was thirsty on the cross He was given vinegar drink. Read: John 19:28-30
- Add egg whites to vinegar.

Eggs represent life. Jesus gave His life to give us life. **Read:** John 10:10&11

Sprinkle a little salt into your hand. Taste it & brush the rest into the bowl.

> This represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin. Read: Luke 23:27

Add 1 cup sugar.

The sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because *He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read:* Psalm 34:8 and John 3:16

Beat with a mixer on high speed for 12-15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed.

The color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus. Read: Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3

- Fold in nuts. Drop by teaspoon onto cookie sheet. Each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read: Matthew 27:57-60
- Put the cookie sheet in the oven, close the door and turn the oven OFF. Take a piece of tape and seal the oven door.
  - Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read: Matthew 27:65-66
- GO TO BED! You may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed.
- **Read: John 6:20&22** On Easter Sunday morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow!

On the first Easter Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. **Read: Matthew 28:1-9**
