



What Jesus Means to Me Knowing Jesus has transformed my life and made it different. "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

Jesus once asked His disciples who they thought that He was. Peter replied that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of God. Peter and all the other disciples knew who Jesus was and knew what Jesus meant to them.

What does Jesus means to you today? I asked myself that question. Jesus means that I am not eternally damned to hell and can one day live with God in eternal happiness in heaven. "Man Dies to Save Trapped Bunny" pops up as you scroll through your news app. You tap on the video. You see what reminds you of the furry little Cadbury Creme Egg mascot. A heroic rescue follows.

You're baffled. You're impressed! You think, 'What inspired that guy to give his own life for a bunny? Come to think of it, I sometimes forget even to feed my own pet!'

Try another headline: "Man Dies to Save World". That headline actually does pop up when you read the Bible. At first it may sound like it's from a too-predictable superhero movie. It seems too good to be true. But it is true! Jesus is that man. He died an agonizing, humiliating death on a Roman torture-pole to save the world. He wasn't saving it from global warming or hunger or war, but saving it from damnation. And despite what some speculate, Jesus didn't come to post the 10 commandments at every town hall and enforce them. No, the world already stood condemned by the law because of its sin. Instead, Jesus came to rescue the world. By the way, "world" means everyone in it. You too!

Look at the extraordinary heroism in Jesus, this world's Rescuer! Really, it was more than Here's a way to picture Jesus your God and Savior: Jesus is The Good Shepherd. He describes

heroism. He, being true God, displayed God's love and God's plan to give forgiveness and eternal life to all! Jesus' life, death, and bodily resurrection show us the very heart of God. This is a headline worth your time. It is worth hearing and reading more about. Scroll on. himself, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). We're the sheep. We've strayed and "bleated up" life because we're sinful. We are lost sheep needing rescue. Not just by a hired hand. Not just by any shepherd, but by The Good Shepherd. Not just a no-name hero, forgotten tomorrow. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who, being both God and man, laid down His life for you. He really did save the whole world. Your sins are forgiven!

Your life's headline reads: "Good Shepherd Dies to Save THIS Sheep". It's a headline others need to hear about too! Share it!

On-campus registration includes all meals, Tuesday dinner through Friday lunch.

A limited number of air conditioned dorm rooms will be available to those who register early. Since the campus is right on Lake Michigan, evenings tend to cool down nicely.

Then Scrip is For You! What is Scrip? Scrip is a program where companies sell you gift cards at face value and give a percentage back to the organization. For example, if you purchase a \$100 Kwik Trip card and they give us 10% back, the organization will be credited \$10, but you still get the full \$100 to use. Each company designates a different percentage for the program. St. John's Lutheran School in Montello sells Scrip and the percentage given back helps to reduce the cost of tuition. Homemade Taco Seasoning

Ingredients:

- 1/4 tsp crushed red pepper flakes
- 1/4 tsp dried oregano
- 1/2 tsp paprika
- 1.5 tsp ground cumin
- 1/2 to 1 tsp sea salt (to taste)
- 1 tsp black pepper

Directions:

. Put all ingredients together in a small mason jar with a cover and shake!

To use:

Add 2 to 3 tablespoons of this mixture plus 1/2 cup of water to one pound of cooked meat (of your choice). Simmer over medium heat, stirring frequently until there is very little liquid left in the pan.


Alzheimer^s/ Dementia **Caregivers Support Group**
