The "Bee-Attitudes"



Have you ever watched a bee buzzing around a garden? He isn't worried about a thing. He's too busy enjoying all of the beautiful flowers that God has provided for him. He is busy and happy.

What makes you happy? Is happiness scoring the winning goal in a soccer game or being the most popular person in class?

We all want to be happy. Does it surprise you to know that God wants you to be happy? He does, but what Jesus said about happiness is quite different from what you might expect. Most of us think that to be happy means having a lot of money or being well-liked. That isn't what Jesus said.

One day Jesus went up onto the side of a mountain. He sat down, gathered His disciples around Him, and began to teach them about happiness. Even though these are not the exact words Jesus used, they will help us to understand what He taught.

He said things like:

- * Be happy when you are poor in spirit, because you will find your riches are in heaven.
- * Be happy when you feel you have lost what is dear to you, because then you will feel the love of the One who is the most dear to you.
- * Be happy with what you have, because then you will find God gives everything that you need.
- * Be happy when you are hungry for the things of God, because then you will find that only He can satisfy.
- * Be happy when you are caring for others, because it is in caring for others that you will find that you have God who cares for you.
- * Be happy when your heart is right with God, because then you will see that God is at work in the world around you.
- * Be happy when you help others to get along peacefully, because then you will know the peace that comes from being a part of the family of God.
- * Be happy when others treat you badly because you follow me, because your reward will be great in heaven.

You see, happiness is not a feeling that is brought about by the things that happen to us. It is an attitude that we have because of what we have in our heart. We want to be like the bee, buzzing happily through life because of what God has done for us.



A Short Story



Jesus is Son of God and Son of Man

Luke 1:35: "The holy one to be born will be called the Son of God."

Matthew 20:28: "The Son of Man did not come to be served,
but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

People spend a lot of time, money and effort to get a title after their name. Masters, doctorates and other post-graduate programs are in high demand. The appeal is understandable. Titles such as Doctor, Professor and a host of others provide opportunities to better ourselves and our circumstances.

There was one who had the highest of all titles already at his birth. The Bible describes it this way: "The holy one to be born will be called the Son of God" (Luke 1:35). Jesus is holy. He is the true Son of God. The titles "Holy One" and "Son of God" indicate that all power, wisdom and authority belonged to Jesus at birth because as true God he possessed them from eternity. His name is above every name and over every title and authority that can be given.

But that did not stop Jesus from seeking another title. This one was decidedly a step down. It did not require a four-year graduate program or many evening classes. Rather, it required humble service. The Bible teaches, "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28). Jesus, who took the title Son of Man, did not come from heaven to earth to be waited on hand and foot. Rather, he came to take up our cause and to die a humble death on the cross—a death that should have been ours.

Give thanks that out of love for us, the one with the title *Son of God* was also willing to take the title *Son of Man*, in order to die for us on the cross. Our Savior Jesus is both true God and true Man. He is the perfect Savior we desperately needed—one who is holy and lived in our place and one whose innocent death counted for the whole world. Because Jesus loved us enough to do that for us, now through faith in him we have been given a new title as well: *Child of God!* Bear that title proudly and live your life for the One who gave it to you.

Boy Pioneers: Renewed and Revamped

The Lutheran Boy Pioneers held their National Convention at Camp Phillip in early May. Many things were discussed and decided upon. The Boy Pioneers are going through many changes and here are just a few of the highlights:

- The Boy Pioneers will no longer have a national office as of July 31, 2014.
 Everything will be done online so there is no need for an office.
- 2. The Boy Pioneers will no longer have employees.

No office means no office manger. The leadership team and the bookkeeper will all be volunteer.

3. No more printed anything. *Including manuals, t-shirts, and promotional*

materials. All teaching material will be available online.

- 4. No more Boy Pioneer store.

 No national office means no more store.
- 5. Completely different program materials. *All materials are online.*
- New names for the ranks.(Hiker, Backpacker, Climber, Outdoorsman, and Adventurer)

There will be no more Buckaroos– all the boys will be able to be together. This will make it easier on Trains that only have one leader.

7. There will be no more patches.

Boys will be able to earn pins that they can put onto a walking stick. The Boys will have to "test" out to move up in rank and there is no age limit involved in moving up.

- 8. The Boys will be able to complete "Concentrations" and earn pins for those.

 Concentrations include Camper, Chef, Patriot,
 Ecologist, Voyager, Marksman, Survivalist,
 Knot Specialist, Flyer, Trekker, Swimmer,
 Woodsman, Christianity.
- 9. Every Train will pay a flat \$200 fee to join Pioneers.

They are hoping in years to come to lower that even more.

I work at the Pregnancy Counseling Center in Saginaw, Michigan. When I welcome a client into the waiting room, I always offer her a seat opposite our bookshelf.

At the Pregnancy Counseling Center we offer all sorts of help to expectant moms, moms with children, even grandparents and dads. Not only do we offer help such as diapers, clothing, and other baby items, we offer them God's Word.

Every client, whether they come in for diapers or a stroller, gets the opportunity to sit down with a counselor. We get caught up with what is happening in their lives, we lend a sympathetic ear, and share with them encouragement from God's Word.

One of the ways in which we share God's Word is through the use of the Bible Teaching Series books, located in the counseling room on the bookshelf. These books touch on a variety of topics that are pertinent to our clients, such as baptism, marriage, God's law, and the precious news of what Jesus has done for us. Just recently we have started an incentive points program at our center. The clients can earn points to get "new" instead of used items. They can earn points simply by making an appointment and showing up on time or donating clothing their children have outgrown. Another way is by completing a Bible Teaching Series book.

Since we have started our points program, the Bible Teachings Series books have been flying off our shelves. Last year we gave out 483 of these books.



What is Scrip? Scrip is a program where companies sell you gift cards at face value and give a percentage back to the organization. For example, if you purchase a \$100 Kwik Trip card and they give us 10% back, the organization will be credited \$10, but you still get the full \$100 to use. Each company designates a different percentage for the program. St. John's Lutheran School in Montello sells Scrip and the percentage given back helps to reduce the cost of tuition. Recipe Corner: **Sparkling Cran-Razzy**

Double the recipe and you'll have enough for a party!

Ingredients for 4 drinks:



1/2 cup fresh or frozen raspberries for garnish 2 cups cranberry-raspberry juice 2 cups seltzer 2 tablespoons lime juice, plus 4 wedges for garnish

Directions:

(If using fresh raspberries, freeze them in a single layer for about 1 hour (or overnight) before proceeding.) Combine cranberry-raspberry juice, seltzer, and lime juice in a pitcher. Divide among 4 ice-filled glasses. Garnish with frozen raspberries and lime wedges.

Options:

- Fill an ice cube tray with lemonade or limeade and use in place of regular ice cubes.
- Use a different juice blend to change up the flavor of your drink.
