

Gossip or Trustworthy?

"A gossip betrays a confidence, but a trustworthy man keeps a secret."

Proverbs 11:13

How many friendships have been destroyed by a juicy morsel of gossip mouthed in a moment of anger or mentioned because of envy? How many have become twice shy about sharing an intimate secret with an acquaintance or a family member because of a careless slip of the tongue, even if the motive wasn't to hurt? On



the other hand, how many have found their best friend to be the one who is able to keep secrets and to love them in spite of what they know? How many business people have held in high esteem those partners or employees who know how to keep quiet about what has been told them in private?

We know, especially if we've been burned by loose lips, how damaging the tongue can be. We also know, sometimes from experience, how rare and beautiful it is to find someone with whom we can be comfortable and confident to share anything. Is it any wonder that God includes damaging words of the tongue among those he forbids within his 10 Commandments? Martin Luther, who had tremendous insight into the Lord's commands, wrote these words as explanation to the Eighth Commandment (You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor): "We should fear and love God that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him or give him a bad name...."

When we use our tongue in a way that betrays another's confidence, we do more than disappoint, or potentially lose, a friend. When we let loose with some nugget of information (even if true!) that causes shame or disgrace, we break God's command. Can you think of a time that has happened in your life? Perhaps it's not a specific example, but you're pretty sure you've let your tongue slip once or twice or many more times than that. As we hear proverbs like this one of Solomon, may God lead us to confess that we've sinned by the way we've used our tongue. And then may he lead us to look to Jesus. The perfect trustworthy man. The perfect confidant. The one who used his tongue only for the glory of God and always for the good of neighbor! That one who lived perfectly in our place then innocently went to the cross for every one of our slips, every one of our careless words and all of our malicious mud-slinging.



As followers of Jesus, desiring to thank and serve him, let's strive to put this proverb of God's truth into practice. What a blessing God can make us to others as we rein in our tongue! What a tremendous privilege to live our lives for others, using constraint as we talk about them and what they've shared with us! We live as trustworthy men and women with those we love and those with whom we work and worship, all in and through Jesus who strengthens us with his grace and guides us by his Word.

Prayer:

Lord, forgive me for the times when I have used my tongue in a sinful way. I know in Jesus you have forgiven me.

Restore any relationships that have been broken in my life because of sins of the tongue. Help me to glorify you and to serve my neighbor by the things I say and the things I don't.

Amen.

Jesus is...Alpha and Omega

"I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God,
"who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty."
Revelation 1:8

It's a growing trend for businesses to incorporate subliminal messages in their logos. A close look at the FedEx logo reveals an arrow signifying that FedEx is going somewhere. The Tostitos logo has the figures of two people dipping a chip in salsa. The Amazon logo has a smile connecting the letters A and Z in its name to indicate that you can find anything on their site from soup to nuts or should we say from A to Z. And when you look at their website, you can find just about anything you could ever imagine.

It's interesting then that no less than three times in the book of Revelation, Jesus reveals himself as the Alpha and the Omega. One such time is in chapter 1 verse 8 where we read, "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty." Alpha is the first letter in the Greek alphabet and Omega is the last letter. In other words, he is our A to Z. He is everything we need.

He meets our greatest need for forgiveness of sins with his own perfect life and subsequent suffering and death. He gives us faith to receive that forgiveness and all of the other blessings he connects to it, including salvation and eternal life. We can't earn his forgiveness. We can't go online to Amazon and buy it. Jesus simply gives it to us as a gift of his love.

From the beginning of our life to the end, he promises to be with us always. In times of trial and frustration, he supports and strengthens us. In grief and pain, he comforts us. With times of joy, he blesses us. And he promises to meet all our needs for food and clothes and shelter and companionship. We don't have to wonder if he can or will. There's no search bar where we have to type in the keywords of a product we're looking for. Jesus, the Alpha and the Omega, promises in his Word to supply all that we could possibly need, in this life and in the next in heaven.

Sudanese Outreach Continues

If you walk by Lincoln Heights Lutheran Church on a Sunday afternoon, you may hear the beating of drums and singing that you don't understand. This is the joyful noise of a

language. In 2006, a group of Sudanese refugees attended Lincoln Heights Lutheran looking for a church that taught the Word of God in truth and purity. After a period of instruction and the difficult work of translating materials into the Nuer language, several families became members of the church. There are currently seventeen communicant members of Lincoln Heights from this group as well as many baptized children. Part of this ministry among the Sudanese has been helping with physical needs. This help continues, but the ministry began with sharing the Word of God. The gospel continues to be the main focus. Once or twice a month, services in the Nuer language are held on Sunday afternoons. Most of the children have no problem with English since they were born in the US and are taking regular catechism classes, have been involved with Sunday School and Vacation Bible School.

In order to reach those who primarily speak Nuer, we have begun a system of training. Working with Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary and several other WELS congregations we have developed a plan of study for the Sudanese who wish to be spiritual leaders for their people. At Lincoln Heights, six men and women are currently going through the "Life of Christ" course offered through the Congregational Assistant Program (CAP). This is the beginning of their training in the Word of God. God willing, they will be able to complete their training so they can serve the Nuer speakers of our congregation as their people have asked them to do. There are also many Sudanese in our community without a solid connection to a church. The Sudanese members of Lincoln Heights regularly reach out with the gospel to this community. These Sudanese believers are also very concerned about their friends and family in South Sudan. Many of them fled to Ethiopia during the civil war and still live there. Although the civil war with the north has ended and South Sudan is an independent country, war continues. A church in Gambella, Ethiopia has close connections with the believers here through financial support and personal visits. With God's help, we hope that those who are trained in the Scriptures in America can make trips to train others in South Sudan and Ethiopia to give the certain hope of eternal life in Jesus to those who need it.

4-5 thawed boneless, skinless chicken breasts 3 bell peppers (yellow, red, and orange), sliced

ı large onion, sliced


ı package taco seasoning

8-10 flour or corn tortillas
