



## From our Pastor

## An Unlikely Example

I've been doing a lot of praying for and thinking about the members of our congregation lately. I thank God for every one of you with your varied gifts and abilities, differences in health and wealth and age. I am happy to witness Christian faith and love in action. We are richly blessed.

I marvel at the Christian service being done by the members of our congregation, but this is also where I sense a little disconnect. As is the case in any group, there are some among us who seem unwilling to serve in any capacity at all. Others may be unable to serve for a variety of reasons (or serve quietly in their own way). Still others seem to jump at any and every opportunity to serve their fellow Christians and their Lord.

We have all received a tremendous amount of blessings from our gracious God. It is fitting that we daily meditate on the Gospel message of salvation through faith in Christ. When we regularly consider the height, depth, and breadth of God's love to us sinners, we are prompted by His grace to respond with grateful hearts and joyful service.

A segment of our congregation has really stepped up, and I am very proud of them. They might seem like an unlikely group to be hailed as an example for us. But some of the younger members of our church are displaying a genuine heart of thanks and praise and humble service to the Lord.

I want to bring to your attention a partial list of activities that the young Christians among us are doing as they serve us and their Lord here at Peace:

They operate the sound board
They post hymn numbers
They teach Sunday school
They plan fellowship activities
They design bulletin covers
They fold bulletins and newsletters
They plan and serve coffee hours
They babysit for young families
They operate and keep up the church library
They sing and play instruments in worship

They set up communion

They arrange and take care of flower bouquets for the altar

They clean and mop the church

They encourage us and others with Christian words and personalized cards

They even welcome us into God's house by holding open the church doors from time-to-time
To say that the young Christians among us WILL be the leaders of our church is true to a point. But I think it
would be better said that these young Christians living their faith and serving us ARE ALREADY leaders in
our congregation.

I pray that those of us who have a little gray hair, or a lot, would have a greater appreciation for the Christian youth of our congregation and make a point of encouraging them in their lives of faith. I pray also that we are inspired by their many examples of service, and take the opportunity to examine our own lives and evaluate how we can better serve our Lord and each other.

And to these young, faithful Christians who are often serving quietly in the congregation: Thank you for all that you do. And I encourage you with the words of 1 Timothy 4:12:

Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity.

## **A Short Story**



## **Jesus is the Word**

John 1:1,14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ... The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

"I give you my word," we sometimes say when making a promise. We say it because we want to be trusted, to have others take what we say as true. "I give you my word; I'll do more of the housework," says a concerned husband to his exhausted wife. "I give you my word; I'll be there for you whenever you need help," says one friend to another. "I give you my word; I'll be at your soccer game," says the young business man to his daughter, who only wants her dad to be proud of her.

But what happens when we hear that phrase without seeing results? It's emptied of meaning. Ultimately, we need to see someone keep their word before we'll believe them when they say, "I give you my word." It's frustrating when people make promises and fail to keep them. Just ask that daughter of the young business man who got called in to work and missed her soccer game. Broken promises hurt.

But when God makes a promise, he keeps it. He made a promise to right what we have done wrong. He promised forgiveness for our sins. He promised life rather than death. Then he kept his word by sending his only Son, Jesus Christ. To keep the promise of righting our wrongs, Jesus lived the holy life which we could not. To keep the promise of forgiving our sins, Jesus died the death we deserved. To keep the promise of giving us eternal life, Jesus rose from the dead. It is very fitting, then, that in John 1, Jesus is called *the Word*. He is God's promises in action. He is the proof that God keeps his word. God said, "I give you my word," when he made those promises. Then when he sent Jesus, he said, "I give you my Word." Jesus made those promises reality.

God has made even more promises. He promises to help us when we are helpless, to strengthen us when we are weak and to guide us when we are lost. Such promises are more than just nice thoughts or good intentions. God will keep them. They're promises from the God who gave his Word, Jesus, and kept his word to save us.

## The Significance of Luther's Seal

This letter was written by Martin Luther to Herr Spangler of Neuremberg, Germany, July 8, 1530.

Grace and peace in Christ!


Honorable, kind, dear Sir and Friend!

Since you ask whether my seal has come out correctly, I shall answer most amiably and tell you of those thoughts which now come to my mind about my seal as a symbol of my theology.

There is first to be a cross, black, and placed in a heart, which should be of its natural color (red), to put me in mind that faith in Christ crucified saved us. For if one believes from the heart, he will be justified. Even though it is a black cross, which mortifies and which also should hurt us, yet it leaves the heart in its natural color and does not ruin nature ... that is, the cross does not kill, but keeps man alive. For the just shall live by faith, by faith in the Savior. Such a heart is to be in the midst of a white rose, to symbolize that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace. In a word, it places the believer into a white joyful rose, for this faith does not give peace and joy as the world gives. Therefore, the rose is to be white, not red, for white is the color of the spirits and of all angels.

This rose, moreover, is fixed in a sky-blue field, symbolizing that such joy in the Spirit and in faith is a beginning of the future heavenly joy. It is already a part of faith, and is grasped through hope, even though not yet manifest. And around this field is a golden ring, to signify that such bliss in heaven is endless, and more precious than all joys and goods, just as gold is the most valuable and precious metal.

May Christ, our dear Lord, be with your spirit until the life to come. Amen.

## Recipe Corner: Easy Dumpkin Muffins

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 (18.25 oz) box yellow cake mix
- ı (15 oz) can pumpkin puree
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp ground nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp ground cloves

### Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 12 cup muffin pan or line with paper liners.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix all ingredients together until smooth. Spoon equal amounts of batter into the prepared muffin tin.
- 3. Bake for 20-25 in the preheated oven, until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.
