From our Pastor

A Vital Ministry

If you've been a member of Peace for awhile, you already know about our Lutheran Boy & Girl Pioneers ministry. If you're new here, you may be wondering what this Pioneers group is all about.



The Lutheran Boy & Girl Pioneers ministry has been around the WELS for over 60 years (Girl Pioneers just celebrated their 60th anniversary this past weekend!). Started as a response to the faulty doctrine within the Boy and Girl Scouts, the Pioneers have focused on not only camping, outdoor, life and leadership skills, but remaining faithfully in God's Word and seeing the glory of God in all we do. When we craft, we thank God for our individual talents; when we are out at the lake, we thank God for the beauty we see all around us; when we serve coffee hour, we praise God that we have the ability to serve others.

Here at Peace, we are thankfully funded almost completely by the church budget. We thank and praise God that our congregation sees and understands the value in our ministry. By having a budget through the church, we are able to do so much that benefits not just the children we serve, but the entire congregation! We host coffee hours, Advent by Candlelight, and a Timber Rattler baseball game outing each summer. We also have one fundraiser each year– our Annual Chili Dinner and Silent Auction. That is being held on Satur-day, November 1 from 5-7 pm. Be sure to join us for this great night!

We also know that serving our church family goes beyond the "fun" stuff. We, as a group, clean the church, are on the schedule to deep clean the kitchen once a year, have a water table at the Jailbreak Marathon and have a booth at Blue Ribbon Kids' Day.

On an individual level, there are Pioneers (and former Pioneers) serving within our congregation as sound techs, as librarians, who put up hymn numbers on the hymn boards, who change Bible verses on the hallway sign, as Sunday School teachers, bulletin cover-makers, event planners and as VBS helpers.

The Pioneers benefits not only the boys and girls who attend meetings. It benefits the leaders who get to study God's Word right along side of our youth. It benefits parents, who can join in on the Bible studies and get to know other adults at our church. It benefits our congregation as the Pioneers beautify a service with songs and words from the Bible, leads a women's devotion at Advent by Candlelight, and serves brats up to family and friends at our Timber Rattler outing. The Pioneers benefits our community as we hand out water and power bars while cheering loudly at the Jailbreak Marathon, and as we make crafts and chat with families at Blue Ribbon Kids' Day.

The local Pioneers ministry is just a small part of the National Pioneers ministry. Like most WELS ministries, the National Boy and Girl Pioneers struggle monetarily. Neither the Boy or the Girl Pioneers receive any synod dollars. The Boy Pioneers closed its national office this past summer and the Girl Pioneers, due to water damage and an uncooperative landlord, has decided to move its national office to the home of the Executive Director. The Girl Pioneers have about 150 active caravans, while the Boy Pioneers have about 100. Support this ministry with your prayers, will you? Pray that other congregations know and love this ministry just as much as we do here at Peace. Pray that God bless this ministry, even through these seemingly rough times.

You don't have to be a member of Peace to join the Pioneers and it's never too late! If you know of a family that would benefit from Pioneers, please let them know about it. Roughly half of our Pioneers here at Peace are not members of Peace and half of that number are unchurched families. Reaching out with God's Word through Pioneers is something we do!

You can talk to any Pioneers leader for more information about Pioneers. As leaders, we want to thank you for letting us serve both the youth and you through this vital ministry!

Hymnal Project Member Survey

The WELS Hymnal Project team is asking for your input! Be a part of the development process by filling out a survey about the current WELS Christian Worship and Christian Worship Supplement hymn books and how you use them in worship and personally. It will only take about 20 minutes. During 2014, the WELS Hymnal Project has conducted three surveys to solicit input about how the current hymnal is being used and how the new hymnal can best serve our church body. The first was for pastors, the second for teachers, and the third for musicians. This fourth survey, intended for all WELS members, will ask for feedback on things like chanting psalms, instruments that accompany worship, wording for the songs and prayers of worship, and singing hymns and songs of the liturgy in four-part harmony.

Recipe Corner: Turkey Cookies

Looking for a fun recipe to try with your children or *qrandchildren?* Then this is the one for you! It's easy enough for them to help you with every step!



Ingredients 16.5 oz roll refrigerated sugar cookie dough 1 tub chocolate frosting Candy Corn Orange decorator frosting Mini m&m's Directions 1. Bake cookies per package directions. Let cool.

- 2. Spoon chocolate frosting into a 1-qt Ziploc bag. Seal. Snip a corner off the bag.
- On each cookie, pipe frosting onto outer edge of half of the cookie. Arrange candy corns over frosting to make the feathers.
- 4. Pipe orange frosting to make the beak and feet.
- 5. Use the orange frosting to attach the mini m&m's as eyes.
