Real Success

God is within her, she will not fall; God will help her at the break of day. (Psalm 46:5)

This spring our family celebrated two graduations at the seminary. What a special time of year for many families! In the verse above, from Psalm 46, God the Holy Spirit makes a promise that every graduate will be successful. But what is success? What is REAL SUCCESS?

First of all, the trouble with success is that it's always moving. We accomplish one goal, and then it is on to the next. A student may be successful in high school or college, but then the next challenge is to succeed in business. Yesterday's success at home, work, school or church are great, but there is always more to do. God has loving ways of humbling us, too. God may humble me in the future as I age. Success may be measured in the ability to recognize the face of a loved one or to be able to stand another day. One measure of success doesn't change throughout the years. True success is glorifying Jesus in this life and forever in the next. If this is the measure of success then the promise of our Psalm assures each of that we can all be successful: "God is within her, she will not fall; God will help her at the break of day."

"God is within her." This promise is also given to God's church. If you are a member of God's church, you are never alone. God is within you. As such he assures you that he "is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us." (Ephesians 3:20) His power is at work within you! Therefore, you cannot fall. That doesn't mean that every job will out great, that every business adventure will prosper. That doesn't mean that your health will never fail. But it does mean that "your labor in the Lord will not be in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58). The Lord always knows your efforts. God will use outward successes and disappointing failures to glorify his name.

"God will help her at the break of day." This promise also sustains you or me when success in this world seems to be slipping away. Sometimes we will be like a watchman on the city walls at Jerusalem. We will peer into the eerie night and hope for daylight and safety to come quickly. Hold on. The day is coming when you will see God's help. This confidence will be seen by others too. God will be glorified even in those darkest times just before the dawn.

That is true success: to let your confidence in the Lord be evident in this life and to receive the crown of eternal life. This amazing and incomparable success is available to every graduate this spring. Sadly, many will focus on some moving target of success. They will not see that real success is staying closely connected to Christ who already successfully saved every sinner!

This is my prayer for all the graduates in your household and mine and for all of us. Cling to the promise that God gives to his church. To be successful, remain a part of that church. Spend time strengthening your relationship with Jesus. Know his forgiveness and his love. Then face your future with this confidence: "I will not fail. God will be with me all the way. He will be glorified in my life, and he will keep me unto everlasting life."

That's the ultimate success story.

What does the Holy Spirit do for us?

A famous doctor once conducted a series of autopsies in which he made a stunning observation. Here is how it happened. He had carefully examined the body of a convicted murderer when he noticed a connection to the body of a convicted thief. The two individuals had the exact same internal problem. It got a little crazier. He went back over the notes from a few other cases and he discovered that a few more bodies had the same internal problem. But it didn't stop there. He went back over all his cases and, regardless of the person's background, all of the people had that same internal problem. The doctor shared his findings in a book which is still the top-selling book of all time.

Do you want to know what the connection was between all of those people? They all had heart problems. You have probably heard the name of the doctor. His name is Jesus. Jesus once pointed out (Mark 7) that all evil thoughts and actions come from within the heart. When someone cuts you off on the highway and your first reaction is NOT to smile and wave, it comes from within the heart. When someone hurts your feelings and you want to hurt them back, it comes from within the heart. When you say something in anger that you immediately want to take back, it comes from within the heart.

That is the problem. So what is the solution? One man said it well, "Create in me a pure heart, O God" (Psalm 51:10). We need new and pure hearts and God is the only one who can create them. This is where the work of God the Holy Spirit comes in. He uses something sharper than a surgeon's scalpel to penetrate and change the heart. The Holy Spirit uses the Word of God. Like a skilled surgeon, the Holy Spirit cuts deeply in order to heal divinely. The Holy Spirit uses that Word of God to teach us that the "blood of Jesus purifies us from all sin" (1 John 1:17). The Holy Spirit uses that Word of God to change the heart so that it beats with faith and hope and love. The Holy Spirit uses the Word of God so that it pours out joy, peace, patience, kindness, and goodness. Thank the Holy Spirit for your new heart!
